Innovations from Impositions



If necessity is the mother of invention then restricted movement and imposed social distancing due to COVID-19 protocols must be the father of innovation. What a different world we live in now. The Global order for social distancing meant that people in most jurisdictions were banned from meeting in public spaces, and this was manifested in empty towns, empty beaches, empty schools and especially, empty churches.

As churches, more so than any other grouping, we were faced with a huge dilemma. How could we keep the Biblical command not to "forsake the assembling" of ourselves together, and adhere to the locally imposed social distancing protocols at the same time? Some church leaders saw the imposition as a conflict of interest and opted to reject the social distancing. They had their congregants physically meet in the usual way, at the usual times, expecting that

God would reduce or eliminate the risk of contracting the dreaded disease. That idea proved to be highly irresponsible and not a very wise solution to the churches' dilemma.

Over time churches started to utilise various virtual, internet based, platforms to help ease the situation. Virtual platforms that were invented, perhaps only with long distance business meetings in mind. Platforms like Zoom and Google Meet and others were studied and found to be suitable to connect congregations, thus supplying an innovative way to continue assembling ourselves together but still adhering to the laws of social distancing. Innovation has provided the middle While some are missed, for various reasons, the vast majority of us are connected and are able to assemble together virtually while being good citizens and remaining at a distance physically. 
Sports Evangelism (Recently)

I go to the city twice a week to coach this young man and a few of his friends but some have quit, because my training is pretty hard. It was during our 4th session that I began to see what God is doing. One of Romeo's friends Ravin, had been asking many questions about Christianity an religion, because he is from a home, where his father is Hindu and his mother is a Christian, He later gave his life to Christ.

Sports Evangelism (Currently)

Ravin has been talking with Romeo and now Romeo is asking questions and thinking of giving his life to Jesus Christ as well. CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE DECEMBER 2020

Who would have thought, one year ago, that church, in the Caribbean, would look like this? The physical requirements imposed distancing because of COVID-19 have drastically altered the way many of our churches conduct their meetings. We have seen an explosion in the use of Zoom, Facebook, and YouTube. Some persons. and I include myself here, who did not seem too keen to post on social media are now uploading sermons to Facebook and YouTube. Things have certainly changed, and, for the most part, for the better. COVID-19 may have caused some church buildings to close, but the church has remained very much open.

One of the major benefits of the new way of doing things is increased reach. Once you are online, you have the potential to reach anyone, anywhere in the world. We have certainly been seeing persons from all over the world, and local persons who would not normally attend church, joining the Zoom meetings hosted by the various local churches. We have had reports from St. Kitts, for example, of persons coming to know the Lord through meetings held on Zoom. I can also attest to the increase in reach in that "Let's It". Face an interactive radio programme I host, now has a Caribbean audience because persons can connect with the radio station via Zoom. This has added a new and rich dimension to our discussions.

The increase in reach has also meant greater opportunities for fellowship among believers. The waters that keep us physically apart cannot stop us from meeting on Zoom. We are now praying together more, sharing information on what is happening in our respective countries, and simply enjoying one another's company. There is hardly an event now that can be seen as strictly

local because you can be almost certain that you will be joined by someone from another country. This kind of sharing certainly augurs well for the future of the Brethren churches in the Caribbean. Even as we celebrate the benefits of the increased use of technology, we need to spare a thought for those who are in danger of being left behind. Some persons may lack the financial resources to acquire the gadgets that are required for effective online communication. We need to be aware of this as churches. and as individuals, and do what we can to assist these persons. Other persons may have a fear of, or a negative attitude towards, technology. Such persons must be lovingly educated and encouraged to embrace the technology the Lord has provided for us to use for his glory. The available evidence suggests that things are not going to go back to exactly the way they were before COVID-19. We need to understand this and adjust ourselves accordingly.

Finally, let us remember those who have lost jobs or other sources of income because of COV ID -19. We cannot afford to become so wrapped in the virtual world that we fail to reach out physically. COVID-19 will provide us with opportunities to show that we love in more that word only. Let us grasp these opportunities, as we move forward in faith, trusting the One who holds the future.







A retiring offering was taken after the service, towards the continuing work of "The Gideons International – Barbados Camp."




