First of all let me say how grateful I am to be part of such a great family of God. Thank you, for your concern and interest for me, family, believers and for our country: altogether 50,418 have been infected. Many people have been or are in hospitals, thousands sick at home and 6,077 died amongt whom 24 medical doctors! Journalists says that the figure of the deaths is higher as many die at home and are not inserted in the official figures. Your prayers, and those of the other brothers too, are much appreciated.

North

One elder, in his seventies, who lives in the area where the problem started - of coure in Italy - was hospitalised but is now at home. Another one is in quarantine. A medical doctor, a young sister in her 30s, is hospitalised, too. A sister in her late forties has the problem but we don't know if she is in isolation at home or if she is in the hospital.

Two sisters passed away, one was 80 and the other one, from Ukraine was in her late forties. Last evening a very aged brother passed away, too. The sadness of all this situation is that those who are hospitalised remain alone. For example in the case of the 80 yrs old sister, her husband saw her the last time on Feb 24th





My Call to Ministry

I was just an ordinary woman who loved the Lord, I also had a burden for the children of St Kitts & Nevis who were lost, vulnerable, abused, misguided and neglected.

In November, 2010, while in Connecticut, as I was interceding and agonizing on my knees on behalf of the children of my Federation, God clearly and distinctly called me into children's ministry. Having experienced God in such a profound way, caused me to obey the call to start a Boys' club on my return to St Kitts.

A month later, I shared the goal of starting a boys' club in the community with the Women of Purpose, a group the Lord allowed me to start several years prior at Grace Gospel Hall, my home assembly. They were excited and some pledged their support. Many of these women are still currently involved in my ministry. At the end of January 2011, after visiting homes in the community, we launched the Boys' Club at Grace Gospel Hall. Twenty-nine boys and a two and a half year old girl attended our first meeting. That was the beginning of a great harvest! In a few short years, the club grew to more that ninety children and youth. A room was built on the church to house the club, which we soon outgrew.

In February 2011, the Lord sent a youth pastor, Brandon Grayson and family from Indiana to St Kitts. Having heard about the Boys' Club through my son, Brandon visited my sister Dolly and I and offered his assistance. He also brought along other students to help and work with the children. The following month, Child Evangelism

Fellowship CEF came to St Kitts and Nevis, and offered training in the Teaching Children Effectively (TCE) Level I course. I enrolled in the course and God continued to unfold His plan for my life slowly and precisely. In 2013, God called me into fulltime ministry, sent me to the Children's Ministry Institute in Missouri for training and the rest as we would say, is history.

I am currently the National Director for CEF, supported by a dedicated Chairman and National Board, faithful prayer partners, reliable volunteers, sacrificial donors and the devoted regional and International staff of CEF. Through the support of these faithful co-labourers in Christs, thousands of children in St Kitts and Nevis have been reached with a clear presentation of the Gospel and hundreds have been counseled for salvation. Over the past seven years God has also used me to train dozens of teachers through workshops, Super Seminars, Sunday School Conferences and Teaching Children Effectively (TCE) Level I courses.

I give God thanks for the support given to CEF by the local Assemblies. I am especially grateful to my home assembly, for their sterling support. I am also thankful to God for my husband and very supportive family who were; and still are unwavering in their encouragement support, prayers, and commitment to me in ministry.

A person who couldn't simply sit by and watch someone face a hardship. She'd find some way to help in any way possible. But little did Kishma know, the most difficult hardship would befall her. One day Kishma walked in for medical care, and was given the most devastating news she's ever received; she was diagnosed with breast cancer, but its stage couldn't be determined without further testing. She traveled to the United States for a 2nd opinion and treatment. It was here that her diagnosis was confirmed, at a Stage II level. To prevent the cancer from spreading, this young and vibrant lady is in dire need of our financial assistance to cover costs for an urgent surgery to the tune of USD 25,000.00, and radiation that will cost another USD 25,000.00. when she was hospitalised and, of course, nor he couldn't see her dead. And the other sad thing is that there is not the possibility to have funerals.

In spite of what I wrote above, we received vesterday a great testimony given by a medical doctor. He was an atheist and was almost in despair as, humanly speaking, he could do very little to save people's lives. About two weeka ago an evangelical pastor of 75 arrived in his hospital having the covid-19. He was carrying his Bible in his hands. In spite of his hard situation he started to witness and to give comfort to his fellow patients when he had the strenght to do this. He went to the patients and holding their hands he read some Bible verses, preaching the gospel and praying for them. The doctor, as well as others, where so much impressed by all that this humble yet faithful servant of God did. He became a believer! The pastor passed away, but surely the seed will be seen in heaven!

Centre

In Rome several old sisters are in isolation at home. One sister in her forties is at home, too.

South

One entire family in our assembly is on isolation. Stefania, a nurse, a young lady from the other assembly in our town, is in isolation, but at home. Graziano, has been hospitalised and has pneumonia. He's the Head Physician and a well-known cardiologist in a town not far from us.

Having said that above, others could be infected being at home.

Prayers are needed for our beloved fellow believers who work in hospitals as doctors (several), nurses (many) or technicians but also for those who work as bus drivers, train conductors, etc. And, generally speaking, for our country so that people may be eager to listen to the gospel being preached in many ways with the mass media. The Prime Minister signed another decree recently with more restrictions which were indeed needed as the doctors say that the peak will be in this week and the following one; but who can tell? For me to be lockedown is not a problem as I can write and talk on the phone or through skype etc. However I feel a lack not having the "face to face" fellowship with my dear brothers and sisters where I live and, of course, in many other places where I was supposed to preach/teach.



In the south east, where we live, there are 27 assemblies. Since we have a radio station which broadcasts 24 hrs per day we are using this mean twice a week. On Thursday evenings when there is the midweek service - and Sunday mornings at the same time all of us listen to a live programme where there are songs, prayers, news and the preaching of the Word. At home the three of us gather in our dining room and each Sunday participate, at the Lord's table and this at the same time with hundreds of other believers who too are listening to this broadcast. This radio station is listened to by many unbelievers too, and we pray that what they will hear in these troubled days will have a positive effect on them.

Let's remain firm on the solid ground and on the Lord's promises. Thank you for your prayers: we need them and we feel them, too. Let's pray for one another till we'll be ALL TOGETHER with no restrictions to sing and worship the Lamb of God! And for eternity!

Chairman's Message 2020

"It is the best of times; it is the worst of times..."

I have taken some liberties with the opening lines of A Tale of Two Cities to try to describe this present time, in which the world is grappling with COVID-19. Up to the time of writing, there have been over seven hundred thousand cases and over thirty-three thousand deaths worldwide. We are dealing with a disease that threatens to overwhelm the health systems of countries that are much more developed than the countries of our region. How are God's people to function in such a time as this? What might an appropriate response to COVID-19 look like?

First and foremost, it is crucial that we do not panic. At a time when men's hearts are failing them for fear, we must draw upon the resources God has provided to enable us to live above fear. The antidote to fear is faith. As the psalmist puts it, "When I am afraid, I will trust in you." (Psalm 56: 3) This is a time for us to put our trust in God, our refuge and strength, our very present help in trouble. I am not talking about a flippant denial of the devastating effects of COVID-19; I am talking about a sober recognition of the power of God to protect his people, which will enable us to stay calm in the face of the bad news that we receive every day. After all, the worst that can happen is that we die, and even death cannot defeat those who have put their trust in God (Philippians 1: 21). It is this understanding that will enable us to minister effectively to those who are currently in the grip of fear.

Secondly, we need to exercise wisdom; trusting in God to protect us does not absolve us of this responsibility. It is foolhardy to claim that one is covered by the blood of Jesus and proceed to ignore the basic principles of hygiene. It makes sense to listen to the health professionals and do what they tell us we need to do to keep ourselves safe. This is like locking our doors, even as we trust in the Lord to protect us from burglars. We also need wisdom to deal with the information that is floating around, especially on social media. There are many 'experts' who are telling us how to deal with COVID-19. We need to check the information we receive. Let us not be quick to pass on what is sent to us. Let us seek the Lord for wisdom to be able to test the spirits.

Even as we seek to keep ourselves safe, we must not miss out on opportunities to demonstrate Christian love. A crisis can bring out the best, or the worst, in people. We see examples of the worst in price gouging and in the selling of fake medicine. However, we also see the best in the sacrifice of the many healthcare workers who, daily, put their lives on the line to save others. We must support them in any way that we can. This is a time to serve, a time to help the weak and vulnerable. God has put his love in our hearts. This is an opportune time for us to allow it to shine out in acts of kindness to others.

Finally, we need to remain focused on the mission to make disciples of all nations, even as we deal with COVID-19. Gatherings are being restricted or cancelled in some territories, and those who are able to meet have to modify their practices. The key, however, is not to lose sight of the mission. People still need the Lord. It is for us to find creative ways of reaching out, even as traditional options become more and more unavailable. COVID-19, too, shall pass. Our mission will continue until the Lord returns for his church.




