Barbados Inaugural Sisters' Retreat

The United Gospel Halls Sisters' committee hosted its first ever Ladies Retreat at Sunbay Hotel, Barbados on April 27, 2019 under the theme **"Women** with a Purpose...Uncovering your beauty in Christ". This retreat was birthed to fill the need for women in our churches to get to know each other better. It was a beautiful day as forty-eight women, ages twenty-one to over eighty convened to hear from God's word.

The morning session under the sub-theme The Beauty of Worship was ably led by Sister Diane Medford and set the tone for the day as we worshipped in song. This was followed by the first message. Guest speaker, Mrs. Alison Branch was dynamic as she identified Character, Conviction and Courage as hallmarks of women with a purpose. Using Matthew 21: 17-22, she urged "in our quest for beauty in Christ we must uncover and remove those things which do not please God." Afterwards, Sister Sherry Millar led the group in some team building exercises under sub-theme, "Building/Blending/ Bridging with a Purpose".

The post lunch sessions "The Innovative Woman" and "Bonding Beautiful Bodies" were interactive and ladies were involved in creating beautiful items out of given materials. Creativity was beyond expectations as the fascinators, bags and hats modeled were proof of innate talent in our ladies. A few ladies enjoyed pedicures and manicures as well as received blood pressure and blood sugar tests.

The final session of the evening was delivered by the second Guest speaker, **Mrs. Ruth Hinds** and she quickly identified and defined the words beauty and purpose as her key words. She highlighted that beauty comes from withinthe spirit of God in us. Using Galatians 5: 16-26 (the fruit of the spirit) she advised that there were things to put away and things to put on when we want to display the beauty of Christ. She stated that we need to spend time with God to truly uncover our beauty in Him.

Following are some of the comments from our ladies about the inaugural event. "It was a wonderful experience", "It was worth more than the money", "I have begun to examine myself as to what I need to put off and put on" "Speakers were dynamic they gelled well" and "We have to make this an annual event and invite our Caribbean sisters."


Lifestyle - Stepping out in Boldness" and "Boldness ... A Biblical Perspective".

Barbados: Arts and Craft Camp



The ARTS AND CRAFT CAMP was convened during the period April 8th to 12th, 2019 at the Dayrells Road Gospel Hall, Christ Church, Barbados. The camp was entitled, "DISCOVERING THE TREASURES WITHIN; IMPACTING THE WORLD AROUND" and catered

to children between ages 5 and 13 years. Its objectives were:

- To provide a wholesome environment for children who are currently on holiday.
- To facilitate positive interaction among youth.
- To provide an informal way of interacting with the students while inculcating moral values.
- To provide exposure to Bible characters whose lives have the power to impact the lives of our children.
- To expose pupils to memorization of God's word.

The camp was geared for twenty-five students only but by the final day we had accommodated 48 students from age 3 years to 13 years.

The students participated in various aspects of art and craft including pencil drawing and

colouring, tie dye, craft stick work. They had a session of aerobics, interactive session on Fire Safety and Conflict Resolution. Each morning commenced with choruses and a Bible session focusing on Biblical characters who left indelible marks for us to follow. Those used were Joseph, Josiah, Esther, David and Hannah. The focused areas for each character was then tied into the need for salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Thanks for your spirit of love, grace, prayer and gifts to the work here in New Jersey.





Special Feature on Alzheimer's Disease

Dementia is a syndrome, not a disease. **Dementia is** an umbrella term that **Alzheimer's** disease can fall under. Here are 10 warning signs of Alzheimer's

I. Subtle short-term memory changes

Trouble with memory can be an early symptom of dementia. An older person may be able to remember events that took place years ago but not what they had for breakfast.

2. Difficulty finding the right words

A person with dementia may have difficulty explaining something or finding the right words to express themselves.

3. Changes in mood

If you have dementia, it isn't always easy to recognize this in yourself, but you may notice this change in someone else.

4. Apathy

A person with symptoms could lose interest in hobbies or activities. They may not want to go out anymore or do anything fun.

5. Difficulty completing normal tasks

A subtle shift in the ability to complete normal tasks may indicate that someone has early dementia. This usually starts with difficulty doing more complex tasks like balancing a checkbook or playing games.

6. Confusion

Someone in the early stages of dementia may often become confused. When memory, lapses, confusion may arise as they can no longer remember faces, find the right words, or interact with people normally.

7. Difficulty following storylines

Just as finding and using the right words becomes difficult, people with dementia sometimes forget the meanings of words they hear or struggle to follow along with conversations or TV programs.

8.A failing sense of direction

This can mean not recognizing once-familiar landmarks and forgetting regularly used directions.

9. Being repetitive

Repetition is common in dementia because of memory loss. They also may repeat the same questions in a conversation after they've been answered.

10. Struggling to adapt to change

For someone in the early stages of dementia, the experience can cause fear. Suddenly, they can't remember people they know or follow what others are saying. Because of this, they might crave routine and be afraid to try new experiences.
